Dear Friends and Family,



We want to thank all of you for praying for us since our robbery last month. The Lord has truly done a work in our hearts and removed the fear we had experienced. We are also praising the Lord for providing us with extra security. We have been able to add a solid metal door to our house and strengthen the gate to our compound. The best part of our increased security is 2 dogs. A five-month-old German shepherd named Max and a three-month-old Chocolate Lab mix named Molly. They are already obeying commands and barking at strangers.



After our long furlough in the States, we have really jumped right back into ministry here in Kampala. We have been running the Far Reaching Ministries office and guesthouse while the couple that normally does so are away on furlough. While there is a lot of logistical work for this ministry, there has also been great fellowship with the visitors who have come through. Currently, we are hosting a couple that is here on a Vision Tour to confirm their calling to Uganda



I am back teaching the weekly Women's Bible Study and Koinonia in the Bible College. The Women's Bible Study is currently going through the book of Ruth. While I was in the U.S.A, it was really on my heart to teach it. I believe it is from having shared with so many people how Brian and I got together and Ruth being a big part of it. It was really from God because when I left Uganda, I asked the ladies in my Bible study to pray about what we should study when I returned. While I was gone, they came up with two choices, a book from the Old Testament or a character study of "Women in the Bible". Ruth was both!

Brian is back to ministering at the church. He is involved with ministering to the staff and to volunteers. He is also preparing to take over Pastor Josh's responsibilities while he is away on furlough. We are both involved in preparations for the Passion Live concert, which will be held the 30-31 of May. Calvary Chapel Kampala is supporting the outreach by giving 200 volunteers to assist with ushering, information guidance, security, and various other tasks needed for the outreach to run smoothly. Brian and I have been given the responsibility to organize and keep track of the volunteers as they sign up. It is a full schedule, but we are blessed and ready to be a part of all God is doing here in Uganda.



Please continue to pray for our safety and for the provision we need to hire a night watchman. Pray for us to be able to replace what was stolen. Pray for a smooth transition as we turn the FRM guesthouse back over. Pray for our daily ministries and opportunities to share Jesus. Pray for the Passion Live concert as we are anticipating 30-40,000 college students to attend.
